

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

Traffic. Weather. Route length. Construction. Chair lifts. People paying cash. Some have suggested that once a bus falls behind, it should become free, to help save time. TriMet says this wouldn't shave much time compared to other factors. Like that idea? Call the number to the right.

WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT?

Put TriMet's comment number in your speed dial right now: 503-238-7433 ext. 5. Analyst Steve Callas says that though almost nothing can get a bus on schedule once it's off, riders often see problems that his office can't. Have an exact date, time and route in mind. 📭
